Report on Blood Donation Camp

NSS Unit of our college arranged Blood Donation Camp in collaboration with J.J Mahanagar Raktapedhi Blood Bank on 7th September, 2015 at college premises. It was organised with the intention of creating awareness on why we need to donate blood and how it could be helpful for people who are in need. Around 23 units of blood were collected. It is needed for regular transfusions for people with conditions such as thalassaemia and sickle cell disease and is used to make products such as clotting factors for people with haemophilia. There is a constant need for regular blood supply because blood can be stored for only a limited time before use. Regular blood donations by a sufficient number of healthy people are needed to ensure that safe blood will be available whenever and wherever it is needed. A decision to donate your blood can save a life, or even several if your blood is separated into its components — red cells, platelets and plasma — which can be used individually for patients with specific conditions. Along with blood donation camp we even took up activities on blood donation awareness.

Volunteers along with Inspector Mr. Shrikant Dharne made sure to inform the public how important it is to follow the traffic rules. Volunteers interacted with the public, the also conducted street play to attract the public and through banners they tried to catch the attention of the public so that they could easily explain them about traffic rules. Certain rules that explained were - at the time of driving if your 100ml blood contains more than 30mg of alcohol then the police can arrest you without a warrant with imprisonment up to 6 months and/or fine up to Rs. 10000, wearing the helmet is a must for two-wheeler riders, punishment for racing and speeding is imprisonment for up to 1 month and/or fine up to Rs. 500,if you have a driving uninsured vehicle then you will be punished will a fine of Rs. 2000 and/or imprisonment up to 3 monthsetc.. Around 52 students participated in Road Safety Awareness program.

NSS Camp Activities 2017-2018


Day 1: 17th January 2018


Other activities under Swacch Bharat Abhiyan :-








REPORT ON RALLY ON VOTER AWARENESS


NSS CAMP REPORT 2019-2020


First Day – 22nd January 2020






Second Day - 23rd January, 2020


Awareness on Plastic Ban to villagers - 23/1/2020


Volunteers cleaning at 'HaribhauBadsawaleChawk' – Swacch Bharat Abhiyan – 24/1/2020






Volunteers cleaning at 'HaribhauBadsawaleChawk' – Swacch Bharat Abhiyan – 24/1/2020










Flag Hoisting on Republic Day - 26/1/2020


Sixth Day - 27th January 2020

After conducting the test, within 15 days reports were sent in the college & declared the same to the participants.








