

Dr. Sandesh Wagh introduced the chief guest of this conference and give brief ideas about our guest achievements and awards received him then our Honorable Principal Dr. Vasant Mali said aims and objectives of this conference he said This conference provide opportunities for academicians from a range of disciplines and countries to share their research both through the conference podium, provide opportunities for academics to receive informal in-depth feedback through discussions and to enable them to establish contact with professionals in other countries and institutions. It develops relationship among research and their innovations in academic and industrial environment. To develop innovative ideas, new ways and respect among academicians and researcher in healthy atmosphere. To facilitate opportunities for students & academicians to gain experience in business setting and R & D. and correlate religious philosophy with scientific values to strengthen the humanities and maintain harmony in the world.

Dr.P.C.Mankondi Stated in his speech that Taxonomy Of Anthozoans (Phylum: Cnidaria): Trends And Challenges that "Cnidarians contain specialized cells known as enidocytes ("stinging cells"), which contain organelles called nematocysts (stingers). These cells are present around the mouth and tentacles, serving to immobilize prey with toxins contained within the cells. Nematocysts contain coiled threads that may bear barbs. The outer wall of the cell has hairlike projections called enidocils, which are sensitive to touch. When touched, the cells are known to fire coiled threads that can either penetrate the flesh of the prey or predators of enidarians, or ensnare it. These coiled threads release toxins into the target that can often immobilize prey or scare away predators"

Dr.Sandesh Wagh has stated in his speech that "The Annihilation of Caste' was originally a speech prepared by Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar to deliver at a conference of Jat-Pat-Todak Mandal of Lahore in 1936. The Indian Social system for thousands of years observed and maintained Chaturvarnya, Caste, Untouchabilty, and Bonded Labour system. Caste system was based on the principle of negation of democratic principles it generated theory of social and racial discrimination of defeated non Aryans .The Hindu society was divided into thousands of castes which were based on the principle of birth".

Dr. Varsha Zade stated "Evaluation of Indigenous herbal remedies used by tribal's of Melghat region of Amravati district for regulation of Aphrodisiac activity was done. Total six plants used in traditional health care practices by the tribal's were validated scientifically for their aphrodisiac property. Plant



extracts at doses of 100,200,and 400 mg were administered for 21 days to male albino rats .Their general mating behavior, libido and potency along with orientation behavior were studied".

Mr.Patel.S.I. stated that "On Aero mycology Over Some Onion Diseases Under The Storage Conditions" The air borne fungal diseases of onion bulbs during storage conditions like Black mold (Aspergillus niger), Neck rot of onion bulb (Botrytis Alli) and onion basal rot (Fusarium oxysorium) were discussed in relation to the concentration of respective causal pathogen and the meteorological conditions like temperature, humidity and rainfall.

Dr.Shamim Ahmed expressed their view that Climate change is one of the most important global environmental challenges and the many types of impacts are needed to be understood and assessed, vulnerabilities needed to be addressed, while adaptation strategies have to be developed. The Himalayan ecosystem not only provides mountain goods and services but also biodiversity, community diversity and cultural diversity.

Hon'ble Prof. Rajan Santoo,University of Mauritius started his speech he said "Science and technology are essential ingredients of modern life. They transcend local boundaries and touches lives of everyone. Evolution of mankind can be seen in terms of technological evolution as well. Invention of fire and wheel changed the face of mankind. Various historical epochs - hunter-gatherers, agrarian society and industrialist society are distinguished from each other in term of technological advancement. The technological factors represent the conditions created by men that have a profound influence on his life. Technology is product of civilization. According to Karl Marx even the formation of social relations and mental conceptions and attitudes are dependent upon technology. Veblen has regarded technology as the sole explanation of social change Ogburn says technology changes society by changing our environments to which we in turn adapt. This change is usually in the material environment and the adjustment that we make with these changes often modifies customs and social institutions. "Technology and Industrialization: Technology has contributed to the growth of industries or to the process of industrialization. Industrialization is a term covering in general terms the growth in a society hit to mainly agrarian of modern industry with all its circumstances and problems, economic and social.







Topics covered on HRM are as follows:

REPORT-ON GST

Sadhubella Education Society's J.W. Sadhubella Girls College, Commerce Department in association with IQAC organized workshop on GST on 2ndApril, 2018. The main aim of conducting this work shop was to create general awareness regarding GST (Goods & Service Tax). On this occasion college invited CA Mukesh Haseja as resource person. Ms. Hitika Makhijani welcome our speaker and give brief information about his achievements. Then Our Principal Dr. Vasant Mali felicitated to the resource person.

Topics covered on GST are as follows:

Our speaker CA Mukesh Haseja stated in his speech that "GST aims at to replace all indirect levied on goods and services by the Indian Central and State Governments. GST would subsume with a single comprehensive tax, bringing it all under a single umbrella, eliminating the adverse effects of taxes on the production and the distribution prices of goods and Imposing several taxes on goods and services can lead to high cost and inefficient services. tax structure which can subject to shirking and revenue disclosures. The need for GST in Indian Taxation System will add value at each stage and will set off the rates both at state and at central level. Introducing GST, will increase the efficiency of taxation, improves the economic growth and it will bring whole nation to one national market. Our present taxation system is very complex and very confusing, corruption chance is there, which leads to distrust of government, there are hidden tax for exports, whereas no charge applicable on Importing of Goods/Services from one state to another. Just to overcome these issues, Rajya Sabha introduced GST bill, which will bring transparency to taxation and consumer will get to know how much tax amount they are paying to government for sale/ purchase/ manufacturing.

Tax Structure will be Simple: – At present, there are huge number of taxes that has to pay by consumers, with GST it will single tax to pay, which is much easier to understand. For businesses, accounting complexities will reduce and results less paperwork, which will save both time and money.

Tax revenue will increase: Simple tax structure will bring more tax payers and in return it will be revenue for government.

Boost to exports: If Indian market will be competitive in pricing, then more and more foreign players will try to enter the market, which results in more numbers of exporters and benefits to Indian Market.

 Proliferation of internet banking, mobile banking and "direct banking or mobile-only banking or internet-only banking" concept.



Report on- Green HRM







History :

The Governor-general of India, C. Rajagopalachari named the town **Ulhasnagar** (literally 'city of joy'; ulhas=joy; nagar=city) and he also laid the foundation stone for the township. It was called **Ulhasnagar** because of its close proximity to Ulhas Plateau and its valley. A suburban railway station was built in 1955. **Ulhasnagar**, which is located on coast of the West India, is in the Thane district of Maharashtra State. **Ulhasnagar** didn't actually exist during the medieval ages, when India was fighting against British for independence. The city was also a military camp and housed about 7,000





History of Sindhunagar/Ulhasnagar

Sindhunagar (Ulhasnagar) was build as transit military camp during 2nd world war by British Government. After the war, this place became vacant and soon after came the independence of India (15-Aug-1947). India paid a huge cost for independence. This was partition. Sindh state went on the other side of India (now Pakistan) and Sindhis who un-willingly left there homes came on the bank of Bombay (Mumbai now) with no good money in hands. Looking to the situation Indian Government decided to allot the Sindhunagar (Ulhasnagar) camp to Sindhis who came here in Mumbai during Partition.

Most of the Sindhis expected this to be a temporary arrangement and they will go back to their native land. But this hope never came true and they learned to live on this land. Sindhis started re-inventing their lost home and business here on this land. It is said the total population of Sindhunagar (Ulhasnagar) in 1951 was just 80,000.

Sindhis use to get the red wheat (one which is actually given to horses for eating), milk, fuel for cooking food on ration. Having a cup of tea use to be luxury in those days. It was made only when some guest came to house. What house, there use to be Barracks (Big halls with many doors) separated by grain sacks. No proper bathrooms and toilets.

Slowly and gradually Sindhis started learning and Bombay/Mumbai became the place of business and work for them. Luckily during those days qualified Sindhis use to get preference for employment in offices in Bombay/Mumbai. Sindhis are the hard working community and very much business minded, but making something out of nothing at all is a big achievement. Sindhis have made it possible.

This city has seen lots of phases in development. There had been gang wars for the power and dominance.

stite.

There had been duplication of goods for earning daily bread of life. This is the phase when Indian people were mad about foreign products and it use to be the trend in communities. This foreign products trend killed local manufacturers. Some of the vendors started putting "Made in USA" on products to survive in that phase. When asked what did it mean? There use to be straight answer USA stands for Ulhasnagar Sindhi Association. This city also lost the reputation because of duplication during 80s and 90s. Although now city have gained heavy strength in manufacturing and exporting quality products in its own name.

There was a Construction phase in Sindhunagar/Ulhasnagar. To earn the fast money few of the local contractors started building illegal constructions. By illegal it means As per the civic rule one can not build an apartment of more than 3 or 4 floors, but there were buildings with 6 to 7 floors spreading in the city.

Overall things have settled now and this is the place commerce starts in the country and spreads in the world. Well! Camps are still there but each camp represents its own taste. One can still find the same respect for God, what use to be there in Sindh. There are many of world famous places of worship here. People come from all over the world at these places. Swami Shanti Prakash Ashram is one such place. Jhulelal Mandir is famous for chaliha (40 day fast Sindhis observe during monsoon season).

The city has grown and it is population has touched around 7 to 8 lacs. There is no growth in land and density of people has increased. Sindhunagar city consists of other communities like Maharashtrians (second largest community), Gujuratis, South Indians, Punjabis, each having their own sections and areas.

Climate:

The Ulhasnagar lies on 20m above sea level The climate here is tropical. There is significant rainfall in most months of the year. The short dry season has little effect on the overall climate. This location is classified as Am by Köppen and Geiger. The average annual temperature in Ulhasnagar is 27.0 °C | 80.6 °F. Precipitation here is about 2958 mm | 116.5 inch per year.

Environmental Audit

Environmental audit is defined as basic management tool which comprises a systematic, documented, periodic and objectives evaluation of how well organization, management systems and equipment are performing phase. - Minimize human exposure to risks from environmental, health and safety problems.

Energy Audit:

Energy Audit is the key to a systematic approach for decision-making in the area of energy management. It attempts to balance the total energy inputs with its use, and serves to identify all the energy streams in a facility. It quantifies energy usages according to its discrete functions.

As per the Energy Conservation Act, 2001, Energy Audit is defined as "theverification, monitoring and analysis of use of energy including submission of technical report containing recommendations for improving energy efficiency with cost benefit analysis and an action plan to reduce energy consumption".

Aims and objectives of Energy Audit:

- 1. The main objective of an energy audit is to explore various possibilities for energy conservation.
- The Energy audit provides the vital information base for overall energy conservation program covering essentially energy utilization analysis and evaluation of energy conservation measures.
- Identifying the quality and cost of various energy inputs.
 relating energy inputs and production output.
- 4. The objectives of an energy audit can vary from one plant to another. However, an energy audit is usually conducted to understand how energy is used within the plant and to find opportunities for improvement and energy savings.
- 5. Sometimes, energy audit is conducted to evaluate the effectiveness of an energy efficiency project or program.

Energy Audit is the key to a systematic approach for decision-making in the area of energy management. It attempts to balance the total energy inputs with its use, and serves to identify all the energy streams in a facility. It quantifies energy usages according to its discrete functions.

As per the Energy Conservation Act, 2001, Energy Audit is defined as "the verification, monitoring and analysis of use of energy including submission of technical report containing recommendations for improving energy efficiency with cost benefit analysis and an action plan to reduce energy consumption".

Aims and objectives of Energy Audit:

- a. The main objective of an energy audit is to explore various possibilities for energy conservation.
- The Energy audit provides the vital information base for overall energy conservation program covering essentially energy utilization analysis and evaluation of energy conservation measures.
- c. Identifying the quality and cost of various energy inputs. relating energy inputs and production output.
- d. The objectives of an energy audit can vary from one plant to another. However, an energy audit is usually conducted to understand how energy is used within the plant and to find opportunities for improvement and energy savings.
- e. Sometimes, energy audit is conducted to evaluate the effectiveness of an energy efficiency project or program.

- Identify the cost of energy you use.
- Identify and minimize wastage. Making changes to procedure, equipment and system to save energy.
- · Retrofit energy efficiency technologies.

- Reduce running cost.

Report of Energy audit:

Observation: As far concerning the energy audit, electricity audit is main concern regarding educational institution. We have collected data by considering the tube light, fan, computer, printer, A.C and instruments. Variation in electricity bill is due to different programs, local environment, functions. In the month of April and May energy requirement is more, because exams are going on in this period and summer season is going on so more electricity is required in this month's mostly. Thirty-three LED tube lights were replaced for energy saving. 2 KV PV solar panel installed which is producing 150 units energy per month approximately. It is the effort to reduce the amount of energy input in the college. Two LED street lights are installed in premises of the college which is on entire night being LED street light saving the consumption of energy.




In the first session the film was shown by NSDL which showed the importance of savings & investments. The message was given regarding how small investment can also be beneficial in future & compounds the value of money.




GURUPURNIMA CELEBRATION


HP GAS SAFETY MEET



- f) Savitribai Phule wrote many poems against discrimination and encouraged people to get educated.

Phule for the enhancement of the women in the society and the program ended by singing National Anthem.







As per the MOU with E-Learning institute activities of sessions for UPSC/MPSC/Banking examinations continued for academic year 2019-20 also.







MEGA JOB FAIR







Report on code of conduct and Professional Ethics





He discussed on code of conduct and ethics to be followed by all the members of the college towards all the stakeholders. Staff members were intimated about the code of conduct uploaded on the website and were asked to adhere on the same. Failing to comply, disciplinary action will be initiated against the erring staff members.

Students and staff members were influenced with the expressed views of reverend Principal Vasant P. Mali. Intrinsic and extrinsic values are the common code of conduct of all the professions but for teaching fraternity large to be a role model for the betterment of the society.



The voices of expertise and intellectualism are not being heard clearly and sometimes a partial bit is amplified by the social media. Today Journalism/journalists are playing complicated and numerous roles. The LIS professionals clearly have a role to play in trying to sift through this information and give accurate and authentic information.

Mr. Prashant Pandey's talk was divided into three areas namely environmental condition in higher education leading to demand for change, Transformational ways libraries can respond to this demand and case study of how Flinders University Library is responding to current situation.

His talk focused on how the higher education system is changing globally, types of funding coming to higher education in different countries. He also emphasized on an open school concept and commented on the employment situation in general.

Mr Pandey said that there were challenges for the library professionals to be creative and provide library services while going from print to digital transformation and in automating libraries. He also talked about going from generalized LIS skills to specific skills required in librarianship, for e.g. data analytics, communication experts, blended librarianship and thus getting trained with the right skills for the right job.

Dr Pandey also mentioned that there will be disrupters in every profession including LIS, but LIS professionals should take these as challenges and turn them into opportunities. Libraries should be user centered and provide customized services. He also talked about how the Flinders University is coping up with the COVID- 19 pandemic and started offering education in online mode. His talk focused on what actions the library has taken like putting up signages for safe distancing in the library at multiple locations. Another service provided by the library is 'Book a librarian' where they can have dialog with the librarian. In the current situation there is an increased demand for the Book a librarian service compared to last year in 2019. He also mentioned about creating a road map of what to do once libraries become onsite. Key-takeaway from his talk is that LIS Professionals have to accept changing demand in current COVID-19 pandemic and reach users wherever they are by providing services in an online mode.

The talk was followed by a question answer session conducted by Ms. Jayshree Kamble. Followed by a vote of thanks.


