6. Indira Gandhi Jayanti:

Celebrated On: Wednesday, 19/11/2016

Description: It is celebrated as the Birth Anniversary of the First Women Prime-Minister of India, Indira Gandhi. The National Integration Day is celebrated to enhance the love and Unity among people all across the India.



7. Constitution Day:

Phule tried to eliminate the stigma of social untouchability surrounding the lower castes by opening his home and the use of his water-well to members of the lower castes.

9. Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Mahaparinirvan Diwas:

Observed on: Tuesday, 06/12/2016

Description: December 6, marks the death anniversary of Dr BR Ambedkar, the chief architect of the Indian Constitution. The social reformer, economist, thinker, politician and the first Law Minister of Independent India, Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar breathed his last while in his sleep and is paid tribute to on this day, regarded as the Mahaparinirvan Diwas. The term 'parinirvan' has a deep meaning in Buddhist traditions and refers to someone who has attained nirvana in his lifetime and after death. December 6 is observed to commemorate his unfathomable contribution to society and his achievements.

10. Savitribai Phule Jayanti:

Celebrated on: Tuesday, 03/01/2017

Description: Savitribai Phule (3 January 1831 – 10 March 1897) was an Indian social reformer, educationalist, and poet from Maharashtra. She is regarded as the first female teacher of India. Along with her husband, Jyotirao Phule, she played an important and vital role in improving women's rights in India. She is regarded as an important figure of the social reform movement in Maharashtra.

1. Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj Jayanti:

Celebrated on: Monday, 26/06/2017

Description: Shahu Maharaj was born on 26 June, 1874. Shahu Maharaj Jayanti 2020, Rajarshi Shahu Maharaj of Kolhapur also known as Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj. He was a true legend and a very popular social reformer and he was also designated as the Chhatrapati of the state of Kolhapur in the 19th century.



2. Vasantao Naik Jayanti:

Celebrated on: Saturday, 01/07/2017

Description: Vasantao Phulsing Naik (1 July 1913 – 18 August 1979) was an Indian politician who served as Chief Minister of Maharashtra from 1963 until 1975. To this date, he remains as the longest-serving Chief Minister of Maharashtra. Also, he had a credit to return to power after completion of full five years.

3. Lokmanya Tilak Jayanti:

Celebrated on: Sunday, 23/07/2017

Description: Bal Gangadhar Tilak (or Lokmanya Tilak, pronunciation (23 July 1856 – 1 August 1920), born as Keshav Gangadhar Tilak, was an Indian nationalist, teacher, and an independence activist. He was one third of the Lal Bal Pal triumvirate. Tilak was the first leader of the Indian Independence Movement. The British colonial authorities called him. The father of the Indian unrest.

4. Anna Bhau Sathe Jayanti:

Celebrated on: Tuesday, 01/08/2017

Description: He was born on 1 August 1920, in Wategaon village, part of present-day Maharashtra's Sangli district, to a family that belonged to the untouchable Matang caste. Members of the caste used to play traditional folk instruments in tamasha performances. The Jayanti is celebrated on 1st August, 2017.

5. Krantsinh Nana Patil Jayanti:

Celebrated on: Thursday, 03/08/2017

Description: Nana Patil, popularly known as Krantsinh, was an Indian independence activist (freedom fighter) and Member of Parliament for the Communist Party of India representing Beed District of Marathwada region. He was a source of inspiration for the people.

6. Sadbhavana Diwas:

Celebrated on: Sunday, 20/08/2018

Description: The Sadbhavana (means having good feelings for others) Diwas or Harmony Day is celebrated to commemorate the birth anniversary of the earlier Prime Minister of India named Rajiv Gandhi. Having good feelings for others was the only the mission of the government of Rajiv Gandhi.



7. Mahatma Gandhi Jayanti:

Celebrated on: Monday, 02/10/2017

Description: Gandhi Jayanti is an event celebrated in India to mark the birthday of Mahatma Gandhi. It is celebrated annually on 2 October, and it is one of the three national holidays of India. The UN General Assembly announced on 15 June 2007 that it adopted a resolution which declared that 2 October will be celebrated as the International Day of Non-Violence.

8. Lal Bahadur Shastri Jayanti:

Celebrated on: Monday, 02/10/2017

Description: Lal Bahadur Shastri (October 1904 – 11 January 1966) was an Indian statesman and politician who served as the second Prime Minister of India. He promoted the White Revolution – a national campaign to increase the production and supply of milk – by supporting the Amul milk co-operative of Anand, Gujarat and creating the National Dairy Development Board. Underlining the need to boost India's food production, Shastri also promoted the Green Revolution in India in 1965. This led to an increase in food grain production, especially in Punjab, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh.

9. Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam Jayanti:

Celebrated on: Sunday, 15/10/2017

Description: Avul Pakir Jainulabdeen Abdul Kalam was born on 15 October 1931 to a Tamil Muslim family in the pilgrimage centre of Rameswaram on Pamban Island, then in the Madras Presidency and now in the State of Tamil Nadu. His father Jainulabdeen was a boat owner and imam of a local mosque; his mother Ashiamma was a housewife. His father owned a ferry that took Hindu pilgrims back and forth between Rameswaram and the now uninhabited Dhanushkodi. Kalam was the youngest of four brothers and one sister in his family. His ancestors had been wealthy traders and landowners, with numerous properties and large tracts of land. Their business had involved trading groceries between the mainland and the island and to and from Sri Lanka, as well as ferrying pilgrims between the mainland and Pamban. As a result, the family acquired the title of "Mara Kalam Iyakkivar" (wooden boat steerers), which over the years became shortened to "Marakier." With the opening of the Pamban Bridge to the mainland in 1914, however, the businesses failed and the family fortune and properties were lost over time, apart from the ancestral home. By his early childhood, Kalam's family had become poor; at an early age, he sold newspapers to supplement his family's income.

10. Vallabhai Patel Jayanti:

Celebrated on: Tuesday, 31/10/2017

Description: Vallabhbhai Jhaverbhai Patel (31 October 1875 – 15 December 1950), popularly known as Sardar Patel, was an Indian politician. He served as the first Deputy Prime Minister of India. He was an Indian barrister, and a senior leader of the Indian National Congress who played a leading role in the country's struggle for independence and guided its integration into a united, independent nation. He was one of the conservative members of



the Indian National Congress. In India and elsewhere, he was often called *Sardar*, meaning "chief" in Hindi, Urdu, and Persian. He acted as Home Minister during the political integration of India and the Indo-Pakistani War of 1947.

11. Jijau Masaheb Jayanti:

Celebrated on: Friday, 12/01/2018

Description: Jijabai was born to Lakhojiraje Jadhav in Sindkhed territory of Vidharbh, Maharashtra in the year 1598 A.D. She was affectionately called as 'jiu'. Lakhojiraje Yadav was a Yadava, traditionally the rules of Devgiri. So, Jijau was actually the princess of Devgiri. But Lakhojiraje, along with his three sons accepted to be chieftains in the Sultan's military. Jijau Masaheb Jayanti Celebrated on 12th January, 2018.

12. Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Jayanti:

Celebrated on: Monday, 19/02/2018

Description: Shivaji was born in the hill-fort of Shivneri, near the city of Junnar in what is now Pune district. Scholars disagree on his date of birth. The Government of Maharashtra lists 19 February as a holiday commemorating Shivaji's birth (Shivaji Jayanti). Shivaji was named after a local deity, the goddess Shivai. Shivaji's father Shahaji Bhosle was a Maratha general who served the Deccan Sultanates. His mother was Jijabai, the daughter of Lakhuji Jadhavrao of Sindhkhed, a Mughal-aligned sardar claiming descent from a Yadav royal family of Devagiri. At the time of Shivaji's birth, power in Deccan was shared by three Islamic sultanates: Bijapur, Ahmednagar, and Golkonda. Shahaji often changed his loyalty between the Nizamshahi of Ahmadnagar, the Adilshah of Bijapur and the Mughals, but always kept his jagir (fiefdom) at Pune and his small army.

13. Shahid Din:

Observed on: Friday, 23/03/2018

Description: Shahid Diwas/Din, 23rd March, is observed as Martyr's Day, at National Level, also known as Sarvodaya day. It is observed in honour of those who are recognized as Martyr's for the Nation.

14. Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Jayanti:

Celebrated on: Wednesday, 11/04/2018

Description: Jyotirao Govindrao Phule was an Indian social activist, thinker, anti-caste social reformer and writer from Maharashtra. His work extended to many fields, including eradication of untouchability and the caste system and for his efforts in educating women and exploited caste people. He and his wife, Savitribai Phule, were pioneers of women education in India. Phule started his first school for girls in 1848 in Pune at Tatyasaheb Bhide's residence or Bhidewada.



15. Dr. Baba Saheb Ambedkar Jayanti:

Celebrated on: Saturday, 14/04/2018

Description: Ambedkar Jayanti or Bhim Jayanti is an annual festival observed on 14 April to commemorate the memory of B. R. Ambedkar, Indian polymath, chairman of constituent draft assembly and civil rights activist. It marks Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar's birthday who was born on 14 April 1891. Since 2015 it has been observed as an official public holiday throughout India. Ambedkar Jayanti is celebrated not just in India but all around the world.

6. Teachers Day Celebration:

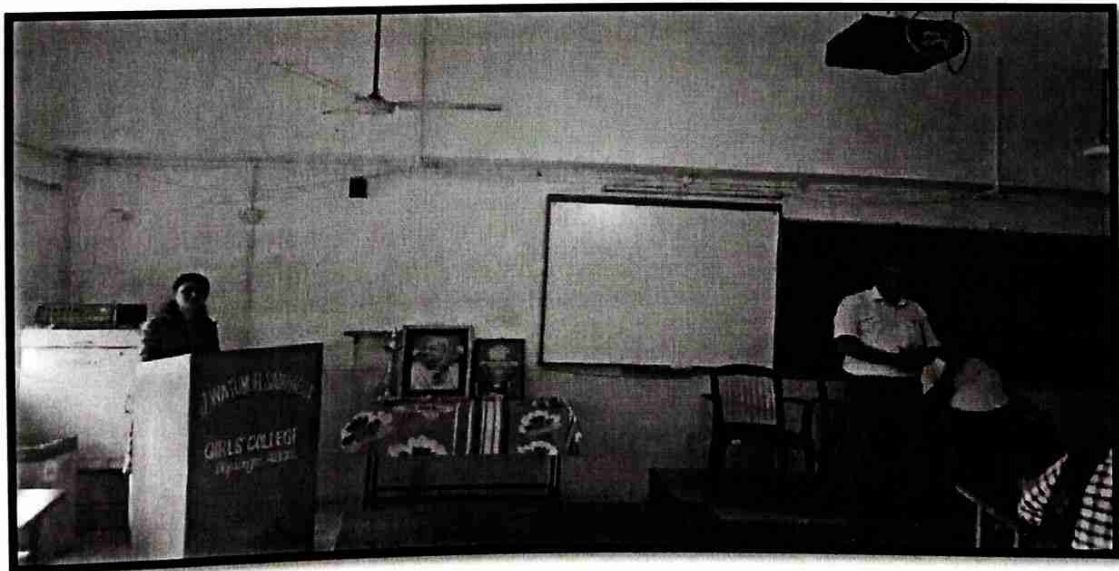

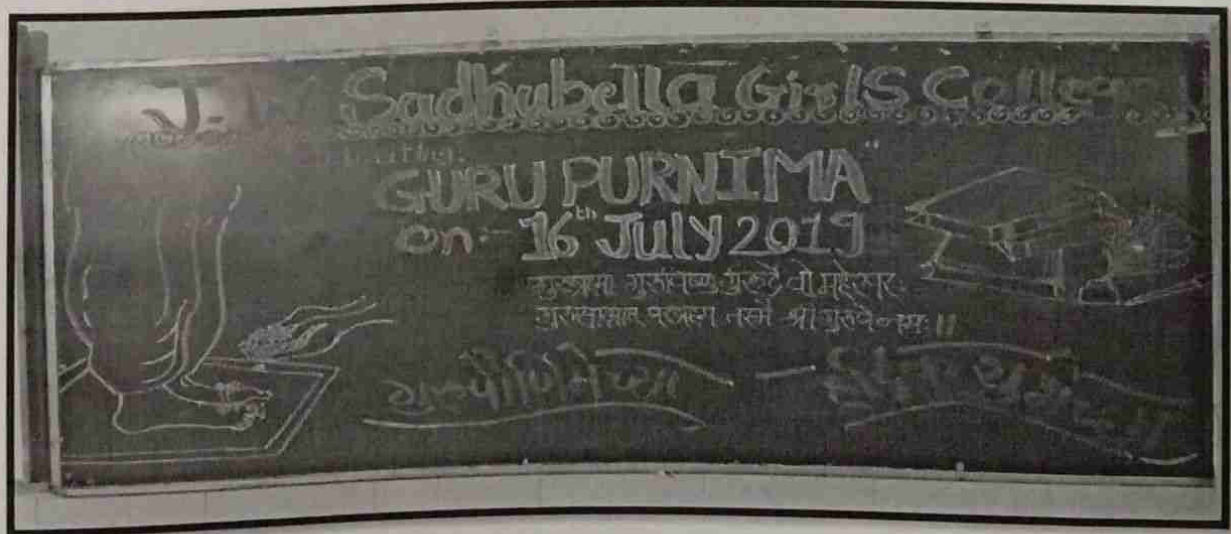
Celebrated on: Wednesday, 26/06/2019

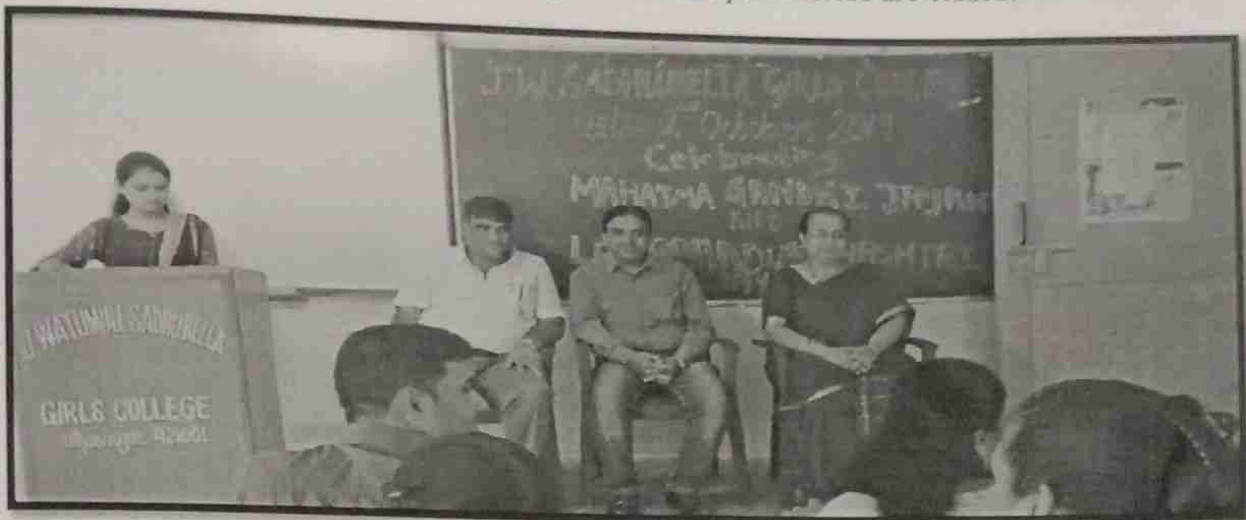
10. Mahatma Gandhi Jayanti:

Celebrated on: Wednesday, 02/10/2019

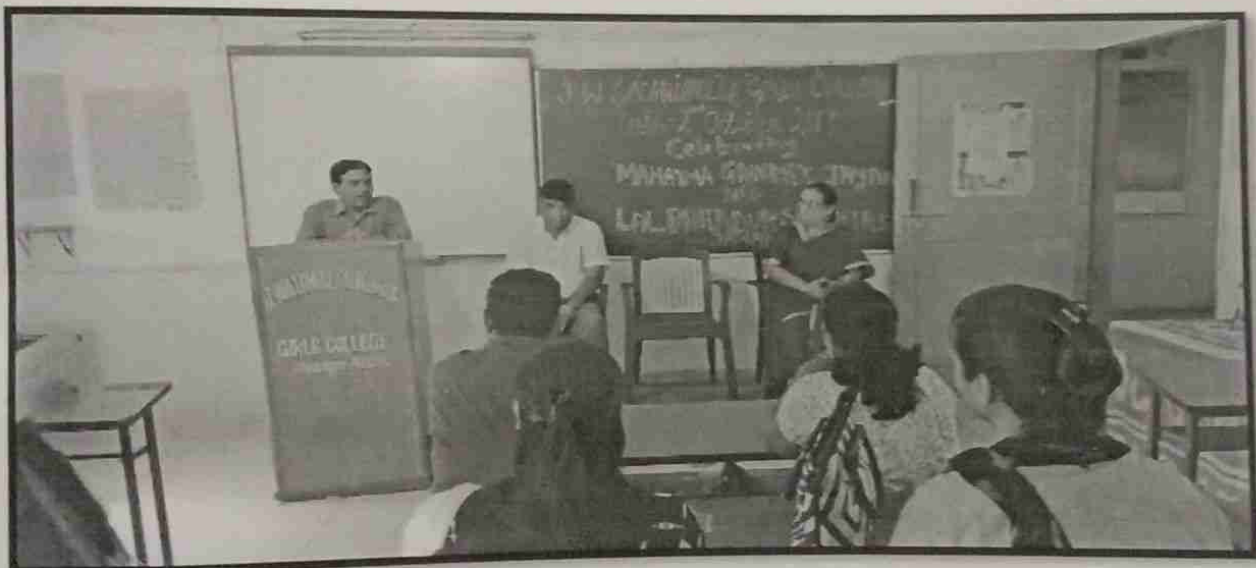

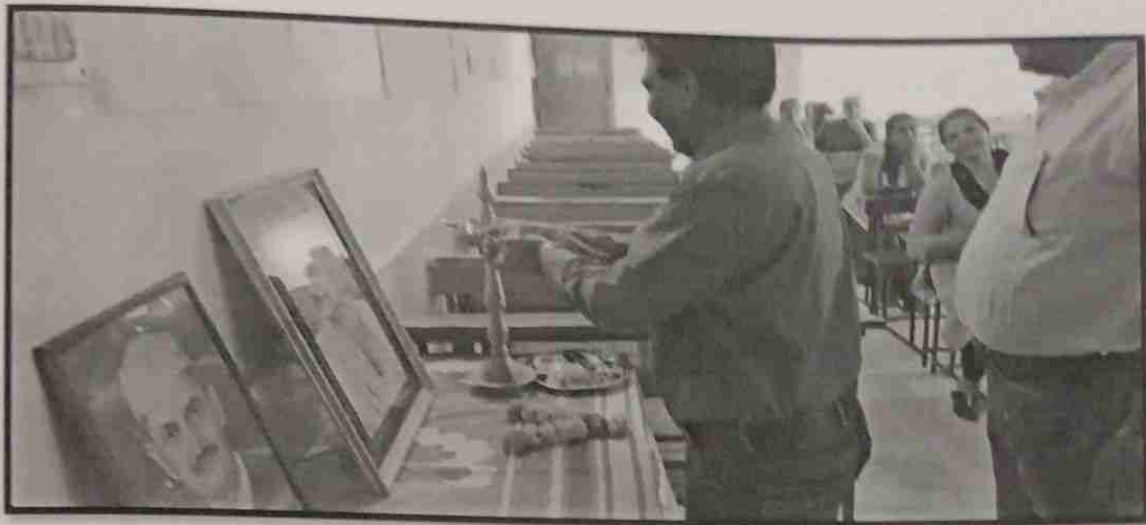
11. Lal Bahadur Shastri Jayanti:

Celebrated on: Wednesday, 02/10/2019

Description: On Same Day, on the day of Gandhi Jayanti we also celebrated the Lal Bahadur Shastri Jayanti. Lal Bahadur Shastri, (2 October 1904 – 11 January 1966) was an Indian statesman and politician who served as the second Prime Minister of India. He promoted the White Revolution – a national campaign to increase the production and supply of milk – by supporting the Amul milk co-operative of Anand, Gujarat and creating the National Dairy Development Board. Underlining the need to boost India's food production, Shastri also promoted the Green Revolution in India in 1965. This led to an increase in food grain production, especially in Punjab, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh. He led the country during the Indo-Pakistan War of 1965. His slogan "Jai Jawan, Jai Kisan" became very popular during the war. The war formally ended with the Tashkent Agreement on 10 January 1966;



he died the following day, still in Tashkent, with the cause of his death in dispute; it was reported to be a cardiac arrest, but his family was not satisfied with the proffered reason. He was posthumously awarded the Bharat Ratna.

12. Dr.A.P.J Abdul Kalam Jayanti:

Celebrated on: Tuesday, 15/10/2019

Description: Avul Pakir Jainulabdeen Abdul (15 October 1931 – 27 July 2015) was an Indian aerospace scientist and politician who served as the 11th President of India from 2002 to 2007. He was born and raised in Rameswaram, Tamil Nadu and studied physics and aerospace engineering. He spent the next four decades as a scientist and science administrator, mainly at the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) and was intimately involved in India's civilian space programme and military missile development efforts. He thus came to be known as the Missile Man of India for his work on the development of ballistic missile and launch vehicle technology. He also played a pivotal organisational,



technical, and political role in India's Pokhran-II nuclear tests in 1998, the first since the original nuclear test by India in 1974.

Kalam was elected as the 11th President of India in 2002 with the support of both the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party and the then-opposition Indian National Congress. Widely referred to as the "People's President", he returned to his civilian life of education, writing and public service after a single term. He was a recipient of several prestigious awards, including the Bharat Ratna, India's highest civilian honour.

While delivering a lecture at the Indian Institute of Management Shillong, Kalam collapsed and died from an apparent cardiac arrest on 27 July 2015, aged 83. Thousands, including national-level dignitaries, attended the funeral ceremony held in his hometown of Rameswaram, where he was buried with full state honours.

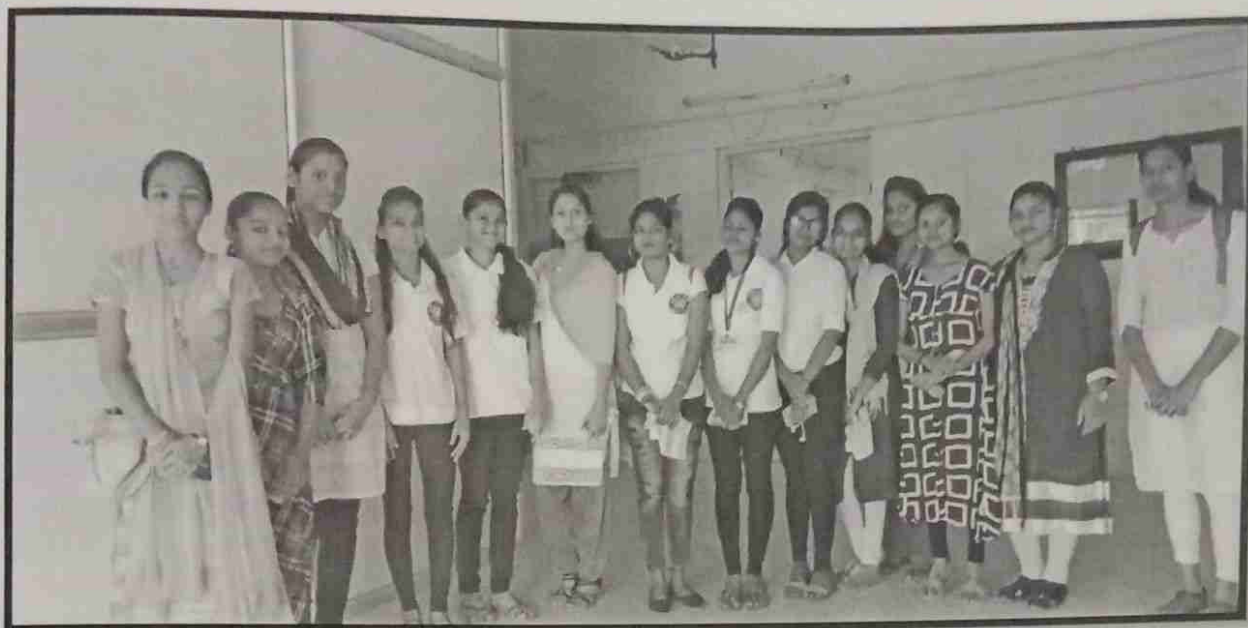
20. Republic Day:

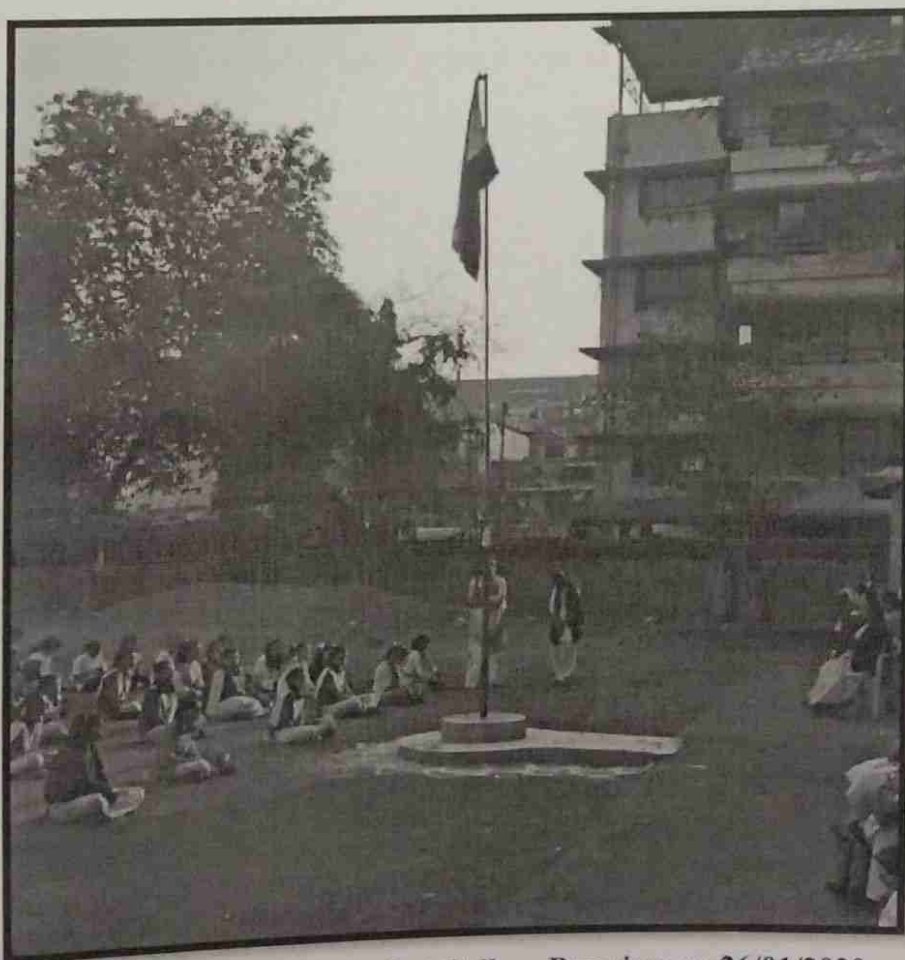

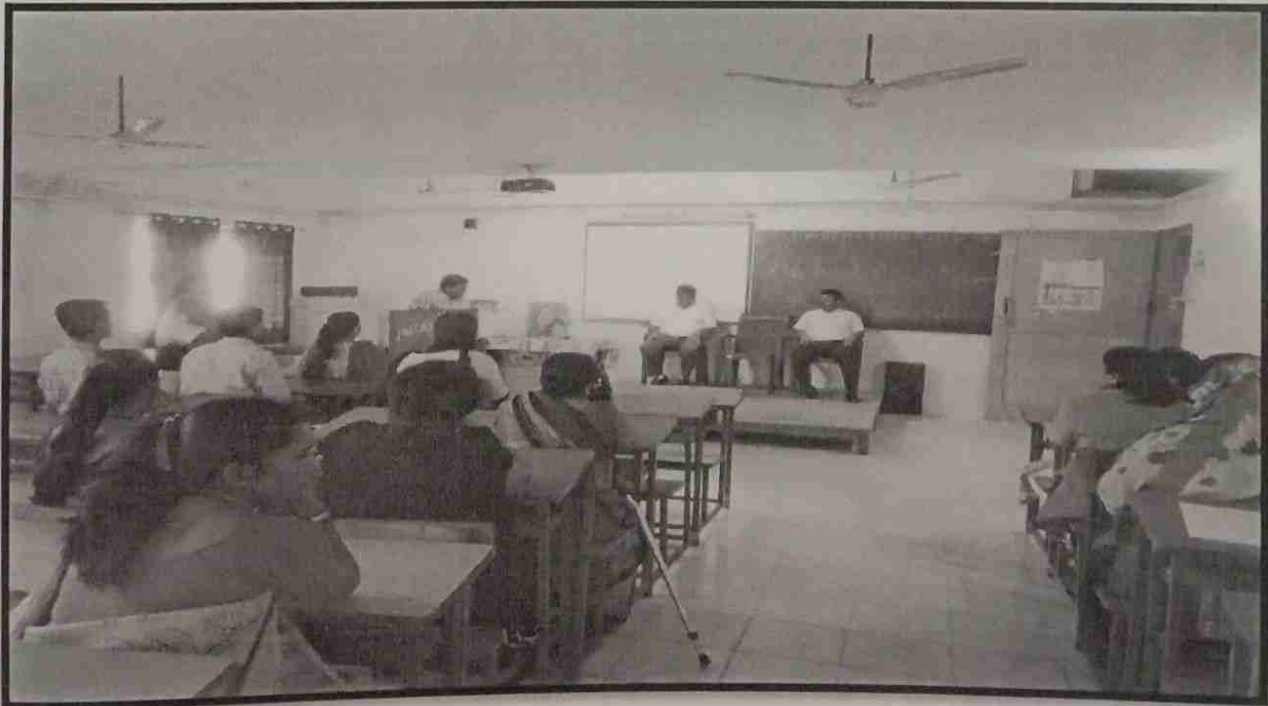

22. Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Jayanti:

Celebrated on: Wednesday, 19/02/2020

Description: Shivaji Bhosale (February 19, 1630 – April 3, 1680) was an Indian ruler and a member of the Bhosle Maratha clan. Shivaji carved out an enclave from the declining Adilshahi sultanate of Bijapur that formed the genesis of the Maratha Empire. In 1674, he was formally crowned as the Chhatrapati (emperor) of his realm at Raigad. Over the course of his life, Shivaji engaged in both alliances and hostilities with the Mughal Empire, Sultanate of Golkonda and Sultanate of Bijapur, as well as European colonial powers. Shivaji's military forces expanded the Maratha sphere of influence, capturing and building forts, and forming a Maratha navy. Shivaji established a competent and progressive civil rule with well-structured administrative organisations. He revived ancient Hindu political traditions and court conventions and promoted the usage of Marathi language. Shivaji's legacy was to vary by observer and time, but nearly two centuries after his death, he began to take on increased importance with the emergence of the Indian independence movement, as many Indian nationalists elevated him as a proto-nationalist and hero of the Hindus.

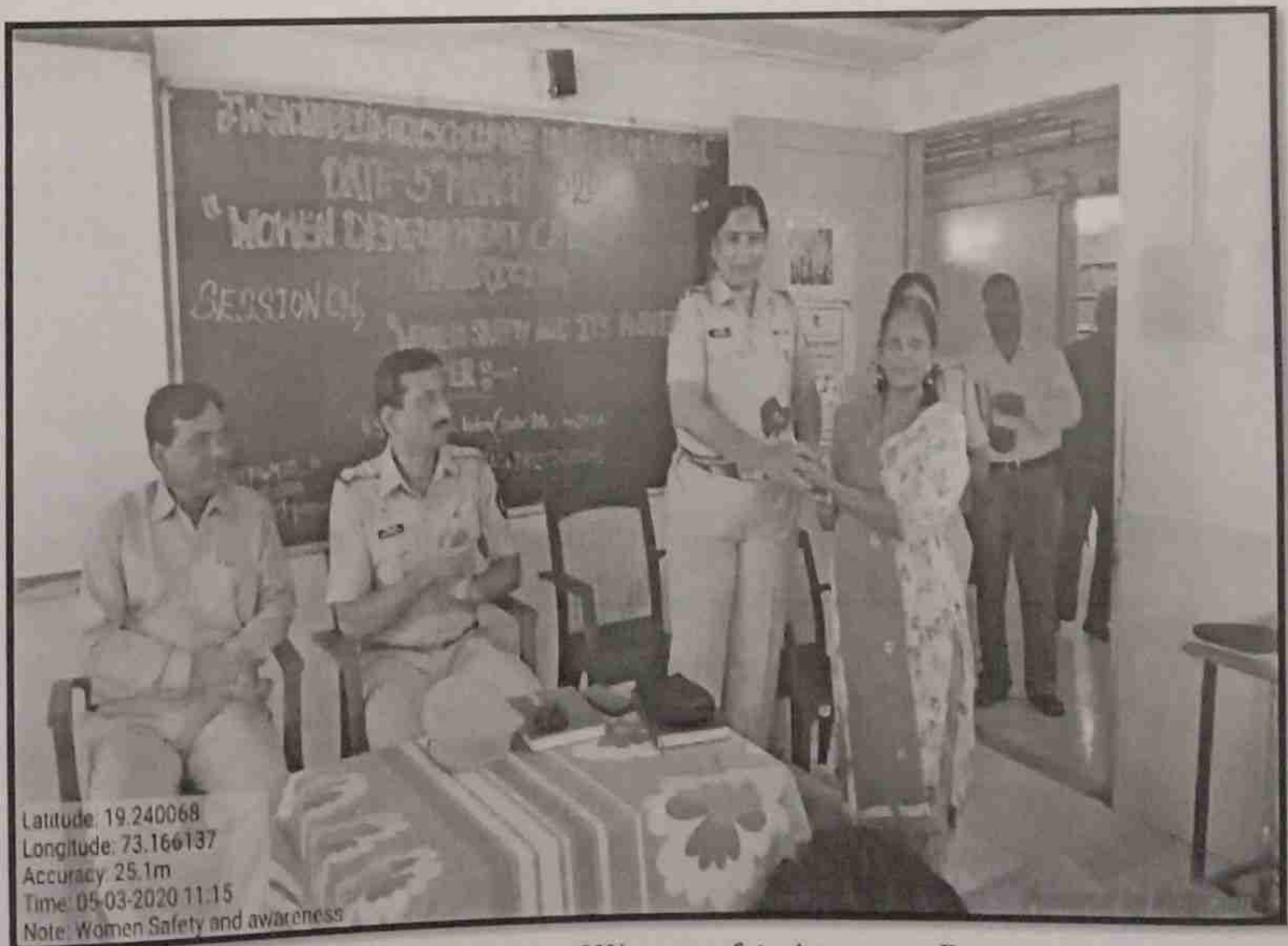

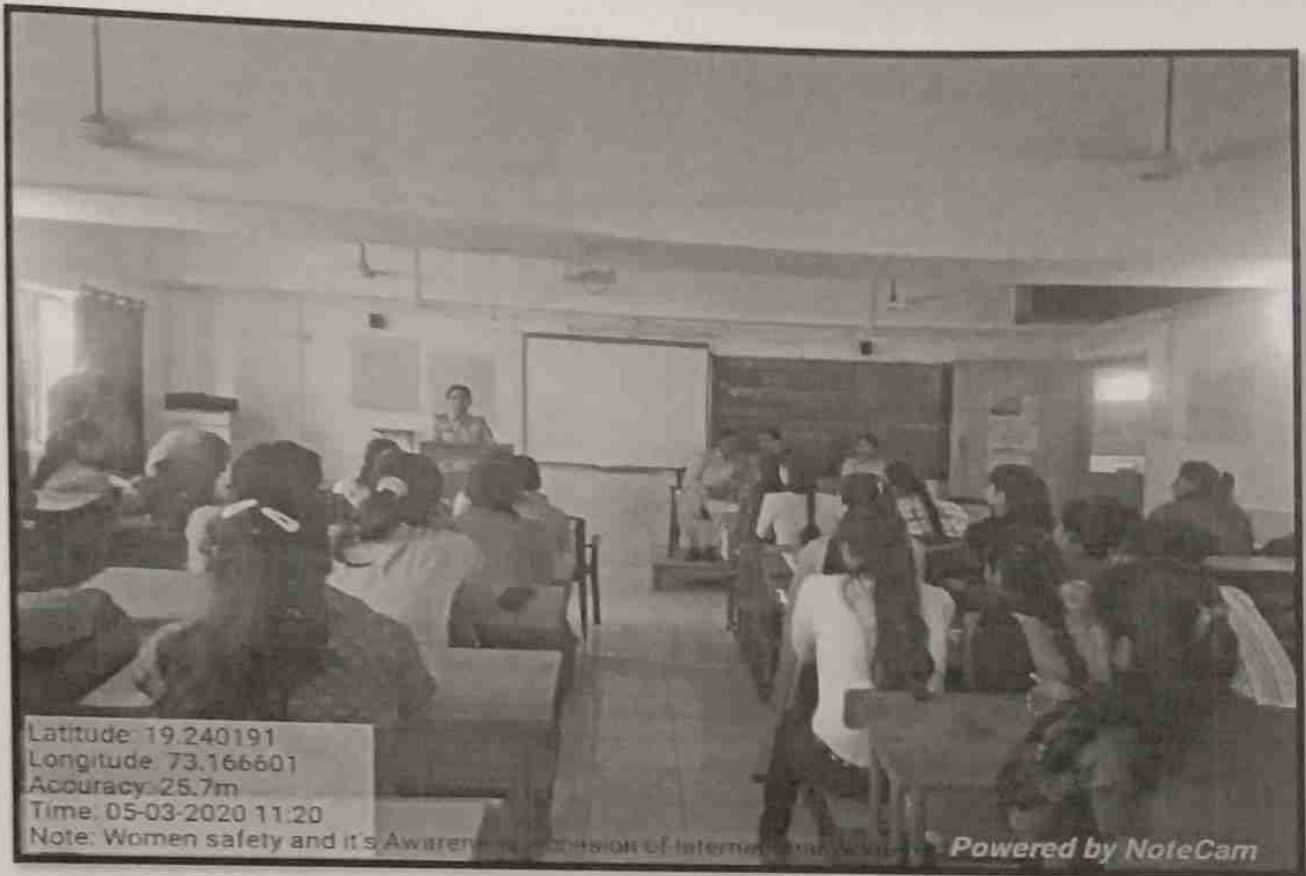

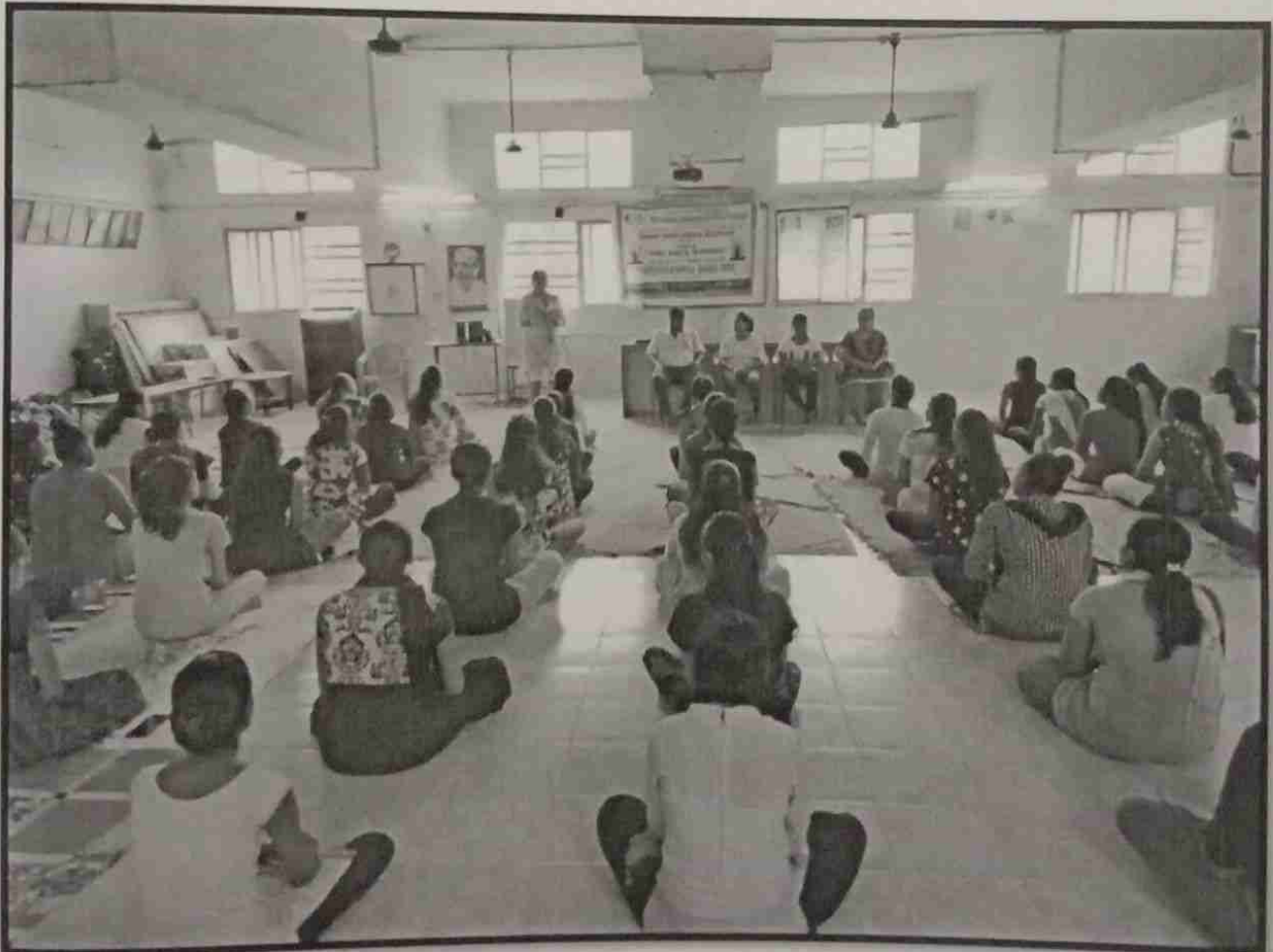
2. International Yoga Day:

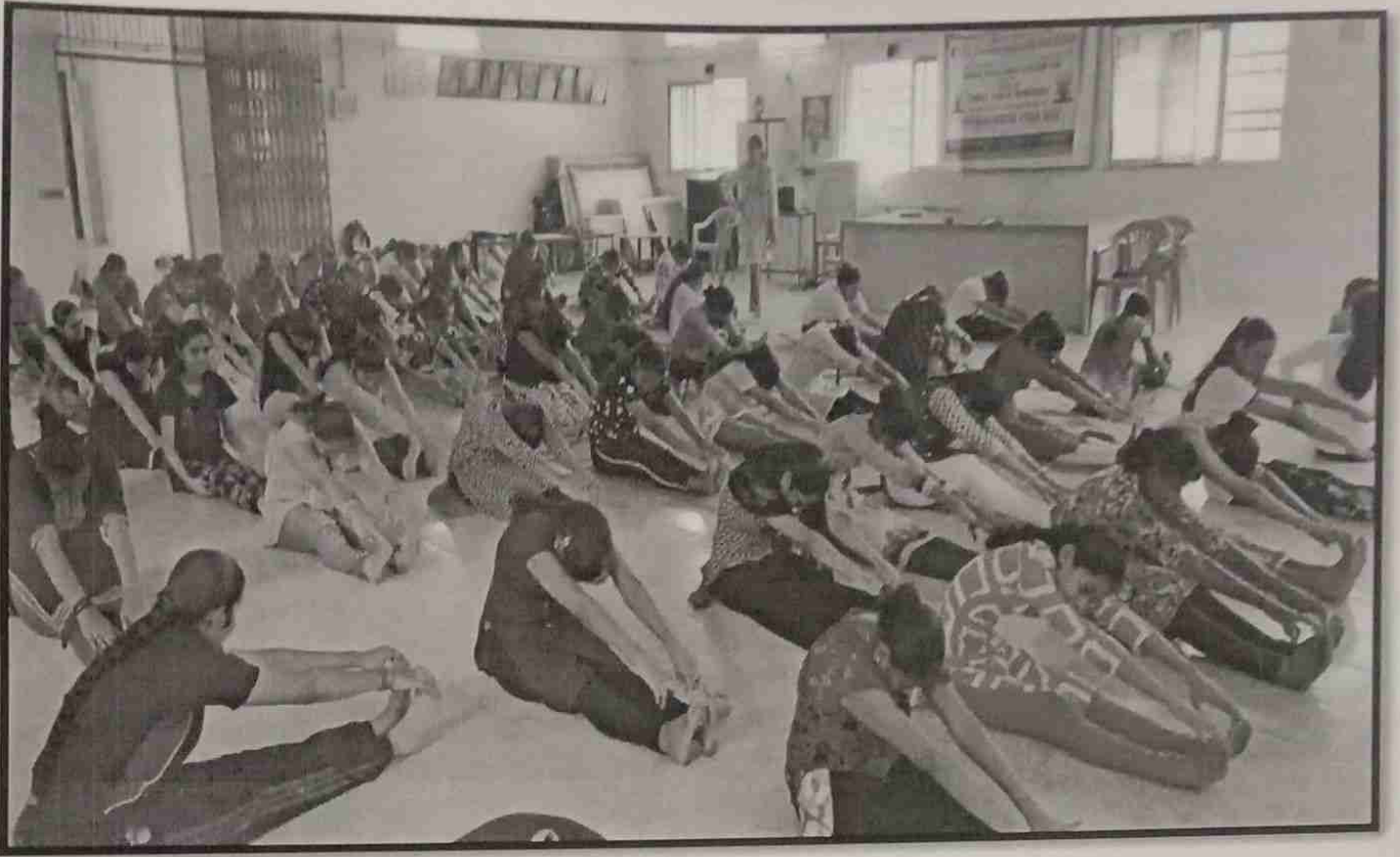


Students practicing Yoga on Occasion of international Yoga Day
