



ALUMINI FEEDBACK ON DESIGN AND IMPLEMENTATION OF SYLLABUS 2022-23


Introduction:

30 responses were obtained from alumni of all faculties - B.Com., B.M.S., B.B.I. and M. Com.


The syllabus has been revised 30 responses

New syllabus is 30 responses






The syllabus is outdated/impractical 30 responses






Only 23% felt the syllabus was outdated/impractical.

Your syllabus was useful to get you a job or for self-employment 30 responses




77 % agreed that the syllabus was useful for employment.

80 % found the syllabus to be job-oriented and developed self-employment skills.


Your teachers were/are qualified and capable to teach you your syllabus. 30 responses

Introduction:



Data Collection:

Google form with questions based on – Teacher's Evaluation, Design and Implementation of the Syllabus, Infrastructure and Miscellaneous was framed for conducting the Student Satisfaction Survey. The criteria were selected based on guidelines form NAAC.

Responses were collected from all classes – F.Y. / S. Y. / T.Y. B. Com / BMS / BBI as well as M. Com I and II. Totally 274 responses were received.




TEACHER'S EVALUATION

Teachers are evaluated to understand the shortcomings of the faculties and make necessary improvements to maintain quality.


1. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as

98.5% of the students have said that the teachers' approach has been good to excellent.


2. How well were the teachers able to communicate? 274 responses



58.8% felt the teachers were able to communicate effectively and most of the others were satisfied.




3. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers. 274 responses




92% students found the internal evaluation process to be fair.


Was your performance in examination discussed with you?

90% students said that their performance in examination was discussed with them.









92% students have said that the teachers provides relevant examples.


The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.

90% students found that the teachers could identify their strengths and provided encouragement.








90% students found that the teachers could identify their weaknesses and helped overcome them.








12. What percentage of teachers use ICT tools/electronic media/social media etc. while teaching? 274 responses




93% students felt the teaching learning process at the institute is very good.




14. The Principal and the faculty members are always available to the students in case of need and emergency

ATR:




DESIGN AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SYLLABUS


Syllabus will impact the learning quality of the student and hence the design and implementation of the syllabus plays the most pivotal role in the education system.

 274 responses




98% students agreed that more than 55% syllabus was covered in the class.





49.3% students said that the teachers were thoroughly prepared and other 46.4% were satisfied about the preparation.


3. The syllabus of the all subjects are wisely designed 274 responses





94% students agreed that the syllabus was wisely designed.


4. The number of lectures allotted are in accordance with the size of the syllabus 274 responses



90% students agreed that the books were recommended.




ATR:


INFRASTRUCTURE

88% were reasonably to fully satisfied with the cleanliness maintained in the college.


2. Furniture and fixture provided by the college is sufficient 274 responses



89% agreed that the furniture was sufficient.




3. The Institution provides clean drinking water for learners 274 responses



87% felt clean drinking water was provided.


4. Students have good canteen facility in the campus 274 responses



75% students were happy with the canteen facilities.








88% students said a well-equipped playground was available.


6. Gymkhana facilities are provided by the college to the learners

95% said electricity supply was regular in the college.


ATR:


 The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.

2. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.






7. The college library caters the need of students in all respects 274 responses



Introduction:



234 responses were collected from the classes F. Y. / S.Y. / T.Y. B. Com / B. M. S. / B. B. I and M. Com Part I/II.


1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class? 234 responses






67% agreed that more than 85% syllabus was completed and 98% said that over 55% syllabus was completed.

95% felt the teachers were more than satisfactorily prepared for the classes.


3. The syllabus of all subjects are wisely designed 234 responses



97% students said the syllabus was wisely designed.


4. The number of lectures allotted is in accordance with the size of the syllabus ²³⁴ responses













9. Students are communicated the syllabus at the beginning of every semester 234 responses




98% said the syllabus is communicated to the students at the beginning of the semester.



Introduction:




41 responses were obtained from the teachers for the various subjects taught in different classes.
